Minutes of the last meeting were approved and signed.

<u>Secretary's Report</u>: Sue reported that the AGM had been very well attended by 58 members, and the Club Treasurer. Twenty apologies had been received, and only 32 out of 110 members had not been in contact prior to the meeting. The engraving (silverware and a plaque for the new hut on lawn 1) had cost £54.48

<u>Chairman's Report</u>: Tony had not had a meeting since the previous committee meeting. However, he had been asked to elect a member for a new Social and Catering Sub-Committee and Gwen agreed to be the Representative for the Croquet Section.

Members' Reports:

Jonathan had spoken with Peter about a winter practice lawn, and this year it would be at the bottom end of the cricket field. Hoops were to be kept in the mallet room when not in use. Peter will liaise with Jonathan when he is to level out lawns 3 and 4; there is a 2-foot height discrepancy from the highest to the lowest points. Discussion took place as to the feasibility of having the lawns properly levelled, at a minimum cost of £10K. It was agreed that Tony should take this matter to the next Management Committee meeting, and suggest that a lottery grant should perhaps be pursued. Jonathan raised the issue of re-painting/proofing the hut on lawn 3, and will arrange this. He would also discuss with Peter about rectifying the rabbit runs when relocating hoops.

Gwen recorded that the Groundsman's gratuity had been £105 after the AGM. At present there is a balance of £18.48 in the cash float.

Jonathan reported that Peter Montgomery's contract expires next week owing to his ill health, he has seen Roger Packe.

Peter will stay in the house under a shorthold tenancy agreement. Noel Westlake is working part-time, but cannot confirm full-time hours until September; Adam Coombs is an able assistant. Noel's tutor (from Bicton) has been to Sidmouth recently and may consider sending students for 'grounds experience' in the future. Machinery - the mowers, sprayer, and line marker have gone wrong this year! MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE CROQUET SECTION HELD ON SATURDAY 25TH OCTOBER 1997 AT 2.00 P.M. IN THE PAVILION

The Chairman opened the meeting by welcoming the 49 members present, and the Club President.

<u>Apologies for absence</u> were received from Sheila Adams, John and Biddy Carver, Josie Davies, Ian Davis, Michael Davis, David Fricker, Eric Golding, Rowland Henderson, Gabby Macadam, Doreen O'Hara, George Sisum, Kate Sisum, John and Peggy Webber.

The Chairman reminded members that the minutes of the AGM held on 24th October 1996 had been on the Notice Board for 6 weeks from September 6th 1997, and asked that they be taken as read. David Clarke proposed, Esme Owen seconded, and with unanimous agreement the minutes were approved and signed.

<u>The Committee's Report</u> was read by the Secretary, outlining the past year's activities. Adoption of the report was proposed by Iris Dwerryhouse, seconded by Hugh Read, and unanimously agreed.

A vote of thanks to the Committee was proposed by Kay Peers and endorsed by the meeting.

<u>The Chairman</u> thanked Kay, and expressed his own thanks to the Committee, especially to Elaine Woodward and Doreen O'Hara as out-going members; also to Jonathan Coombs for his extra work in occasional mowing of the lawns whilst we are without a full-time groundsman. He also thanked all members of the section who helped out with various tasks during the year.

CROQUET SECTION REPORT 1997.

Since the AGM last year many of us have been well occupied! From last October through to March there was weekly table-tennis and monthly whist, both of which were well attended. 1996 ended with a Christmas dinner at the Royal Glen Hotel.

1997 is the centenary year of the Croquet Association and there is an on-going display of artefacts at the museum in Wimbledon, to which we sent the medals that had been won by Humphrey Hicks, and also his mallets.

During the early spring we enjoyed some theoretical croquet tuition and a well-attended lunch at the Victoria Hotel in March launched the start of the croquet playing season. Thanks are also due to the many members who have helped the committee with the ongoing work of the croquet section, both corporately and individually.
