- Ed described the potential impact of the Dollar Spot Fungus which may involve lawns being closed at short notice

It was explained that 2 lawns will be closed on October 1st for winter maintenance so only 2 lawns will be available for play. As the weather may deteriorate there could be fewer attendees at the club sessions. Club sessions can continue and have been booked on the booking system. Lawns could be closed at short notice for bad weather. Please continue to assess if this is working reasonably for everyone.

When the clocks change on October 27th, our winter rules come into force to protect the lawns. Sessions begin at 10.30and only 4 can play on a lawn at any one time. (Philip will issue the winter rules nearer the time.) This obviously poses difficulties for club sessions. Please talk amongst yourselves for possible solutions.

Sidmouth Croquet Section Chair's Report for the Croquet Section AGM – October 2024

We now have 111 members this season – a slight increase on the previous year when we reported 108.

We started the year with a taster session which was very successful with 41 people attending and our hopes were high that we would get a considerable membership increase. The weather for the Spring coaching sessions was poor however and affected uptake and we gained only 9 new members. We have had a few extras joining later in the season. If you have friends or neighbours who may be interested in joining us next year, please encourage them to come to the taster session in April.

The club caters for all ranges of experience and abilities.

We know that many just want to turn up to the club sessions; the GC roll-ups have sometimes had in excess of 30 players attending.

As a result of a request from GC players and discussed at the Open meeting in September we have extended the Club sessions through October. With only 2 lawns now available there is a potential difficulty with numbers attending but the weather is likely to have an impact.

This year Margaret Regan and Cilla Franks arranged the 'friendly' matches for our newer members to play against Budleigh and Exeter. Several who played in these the previous year went on to enjoy Internal Tournaments this year and participated in the SWFed matches against other clubs.

At the beginning of the season in the SWFed short croquet tournament at Nailsea our team of Roger Mills, Philip Harris, Ed Dolphin and Richard Croft won their division 3 and gained promotion to division 2 with Richard Croft winning all of his games.

In the SWFed Leagues we entered 4 Association and 3 Golf Croquet teams. I would like to have congratulated those teams which won their leagues, but it wasn't to be. Results were disappointing but perhaps the fun is in playing, meeting players from other clubs and gaining experience. Our GC Level Play team did the best, winning 3 of their 5 matches.

We also have the Open Tournaments which are arranged through, and publicised by, Croquet England, attracting players from across the country who enjoy the ambience of Sidmouth and the friendly welcome. Roger Mills won the Midsummer AC tournament held here and Jane Bell won the GC 'C' level tournament in September. Peter Nelson will add a few words about those tournaments in his report.

Likewise, several of our better players play in Open Tournaments at a distance – Cheltenham, Surbiton, Southwick to name but a few – Steve Pearson won the CE GC 'B' Level Tournament at Camerton and Peasdown in May. Roger Mills won the CE AC National Veterans Tournament at Budleigh.

So, as you see there is something for everyone.

Developments in this last 12 months have been:

- The introduction by Marian Gadian of the winter coffee and chat sessions
- The extension of the decking behind hut 3 thanks to Andrew Thomas and Peter Regan for undertaking that project
- The introduction of a block Short Croquet tournament. Short croquet, by using half lawns is an ideal format for those who find the full lawn too challenging or are just starting to play Association Croquet
- The introduction of Saturday morning GC Club sessions and
- The extension of the Club sessions through October

- And on the admin side the simplification of the travel expenses and match fee system for the SW Fed matches

I would like to update you on the issues relating to the SCTCC (the Sidmouth Cricket, Tennis, and Croquet Club) of which we are a part. I refer to this as the Main Club.

This time last year the main Club required a Chair and Treasurer and later a Secretary. Fortunately all those roles have now been filled, with Stuart Haydon as Secretary. As a result, the Club is moving forward strongly. Those of you who attended the main Club AGM will have heard from Mike Dibble and Roger Mills about work currently being undertaken regarding the Grounds Trust and you will have received a very comprehensive resume in an email last week. From our Croquet section we also have Peter Nelson, myself and Simon Bowler (as House Chairman) to ensure Croquet has a strong voice on the GMC. Recently the GMC requested nominations from Tennis and Croquet to sit on subcommittees with the cricketers for Sponsorship and Grant Fundraising and I am very pleased that John Cowling and Richard Thurlow put their names forward for those two roles.

Regarding the Grounds, you will be aware that following the retirement of Colin Whitehall, Toby Seldon is responsible for maintaining the estate. He has received assistance over the summer but he, and we, are very appreciative of the continuing support of Andrew Thomas.

Regarding the bar and catering, Frazer's contract comes to an end at Christmas. The pavilion is not an easy venue in which to providing catering and we wait to see if someone can be found to take it forward.

Finance Report for the Croquet Section AGM - October 2024

We are part of the larger SCTCC which I refer to as the Main Club. Their Treasurer produced an Income and Expenditure Account for the Club which was distributed to you all electronically in advance of their AGM at the end of September. If anyone wants to read it and did not see a copy you can ask me to resend it. Their accounts are for the financial year ending March 2024.

Any figures I mention are for our playing season from April up to the end of September 2024.

This year the main club allowed each section only a small amount of capital expenditure. We successfully applied for £1,500 for the extension to the decking behind hut 3 and that work has been carried out.

The Main Club requires large capital projects to be part funded by the section. We are very grateful for the significant donation of £10,000 from one of our members which the main club has agreed, and minuted, will be ring-fenced for croquet purposes. In the recent past you will recall a donation from Michael Cunliffe (there is a plaque on the outside of hut 3) which was used in part for the relaying and reseeding of lawns 3 and 4. Back in the early 2000s we had the borehole and sprinkler system installed under the leadership of David Temple largely funded by an appeal to croquet players, many of whom contributed £100.In 2003 all 4 lawns were relaid with grants from The Croquet Association. So this recent donation is in that tradition of donations and is likely to be used for a future capital project.

Alan Gadian is our finance assistant and oversees our section's bank account which is directly linked to the Main Club account. All our income from subscriptions, donations and visitor fees,

transfers automatically to the Main Club Account at the end of each month and we, as a section, have no access to it.

As we cannot use the Main Club account for incidental expenditure we also have some funds managed by different members. Balances are small and updates are regularly reported to the committee.

You will be most familiar with Marian's social fund.

The Quiz raised £53

The Coffee and Chat sessions £98

£40 was paid out for the drinks for new members at the Welcome evening.

The residue plus the 50 pences collected in hut 3 for teas and coffees is used for replenishment of provisions and purchase of cakes when we have visiting teams.

To date the balance on that fund is £92.

Peter Nelson holds money raised from the raffle of the new mallet last year and also some when Andrew sells on a donated mallet to a new club member. This fund then pays for the SWFed travel expenses which was £390 this year and other small items.

Andrew has a small amount from mallet refurbishment which he spends on mallet grips and some maintenance bits and bobs though wood being used now on hut 4 is his own personal surplus.

In these ways we keep the admin to a minimum whilst ensuring monies are available when needed.

STCC CROQUET SECTION OPEN TOURNAMENT REPORT 2024

Six GC and three AC open tournaments were held this year. All tournaments were well attended with the exception of the AC handicap event. The committee will decide whether this event should be held in 2025. As a minimum the entry will be reduced and at least two courts will be free for use by members.

A high proportion of Sidmouth AC members entered events but entries from GC players, in events for which they qualify, remains disappointing.

We also hosted the GC A level series National; Final at the end of September. This and the open tournaments raised approximately £3000 for the club and enhanced our profile both regionally and nationally.
