 - b. Ed Dolphin reported that, following some minor setbacks, the newly laid grass on courts three and four was making good progress. Courts one and two had deteriorated during the summer but remedial work was underway. In recognition of a generous donation to the club by Michael Cunliffe which was earmarked to cover much of the cost of the relaying, a plaque will be attached to Hut 3. Chair's Report for the Croquet Section AGM - October 2023

We now have 108 members this season – a slight drop on the previous year when we reported 121.

We started the year with a taster session which was very successful but generated only 9 new members. But what we lacked in quantity, we gained in quality – they have become a very supportive group, participating in club sessions, entering competitions and getting to know the established players both on and off the lawns. If you have friends or neighbours who may be interested in joining us next year encourage them to come to the taster session in April.

We have a wide age range of players – two of our players in their 90's, John Dixon and Roy Hubbard, still enjoy playing competitively whilst a few of our members are still working.

We also cater for all ranges of experience and abilities.

We know that many just want to turn up to the club sessions.

You may have noticed that we often have visitors joining in our club sessions. You can do the same if you are away somewhere that has a croquet club. Make contact with the club and ask if you can join in.

This year Christine Bowler assisted by Margaret Regan introduced 'friendly' matches for our newer members to compete against Budleigh and Exeter which then gave them confidence to enter some of our internal competitions which Richard has already referred to.

In addition, we have teams playing in the South West Federation across 4 Association Leagues, 3 Golf Croquet Leagues and a Short Croquet League. Matches can be at Poole in the East, Nailsea in the North and St Austell in the West. As you can imagine we win some and lose some but 3 of those 8 teams came second in their league.

We also have the Open Tournaments which are arranged through, and publicised by, the Croquet Association attracting players from across the country who enjoy the ambience of Sidmouth and the friendly welcome.

Likewise, several of our better players play in Open Tournaments at a distance – Cheltenham, Surbiton, Southwick to name but a few but also locally at Budleigh where a wide range of tournaments are offered. Several Sidmouth players have won tournaments this year and returned with trophies.

Two of our Sidmouth players, Philip Harris and Louise Smith, represented Devon in the Golf Croquet Inter-counties Championships at Cheltenham in which Devon came 3rd.

So, as you see there is something for everyone.

Individual committee members will have said a few words so I don't feel we need to dwell on your achievements and activities – you were there and you participated in them.

But I do want to update you on the issues relating to the SCTCC (the Sidmouth Cricket, Tennis, and Croquet Club) of which we are a part. I refer to this as the Main Club. Whereas the croquet section is led by our committee, the Main Club is managed by the GMC (General Management Committee).

In the minutes of our AGM last year the point was made that the GMC requires a Chair and Secretary. Chrissie Hounslow (a tennis member) has stepped in as Secretary but one year on we still require a Chair and now also a Treasurer and the Club is in a very difficult position. Over the years croquet members have held significant roles on the GMC.

<u>Paul Griew</u> has been Treasurer for the last 7 years and also acting Chair for the last 12 months and he has done a marvelous job but is now standing down.

<u>Peter Nelson</u> has been heavily involved for many years and taken on Bar Chairman amongst other things. You will be aware of difficulties experienced by the Club in recruitment and retention of staff since covid and since Julie Claydon retired.

Peter has secured a contract with Laura Bermingham for the cleaning of the pavilion.

Charlie and Jazz finished on the bar at the end of the summer and Peter has arranged for Laura to manage the bar with her team as a temporary winter arrangement and on an irregular booked basis. We are pleased to have the bar open this evening.

Catering services have been more difficult. Nik and her team also finished at the end of the summer. She produced beautiful food but at a price. What the cricket section requires on summer weekends are the traditional cricket teas for their matches at a price that their leagues determine can be charged. There is also considerable demand for a variety of food during folk week and for the classic car rally. The social members want Sunday lunches and our section and the tennis section also have occasional meals. Currently no catering contract is held but Jackie and Doug who have a long association with the Club have been prepared to provide our meal this evening for which we are very grateful.

Also, on the GMC is <u>myself</u> as Croquet Representative but as you might imagine premises issues / grounds issues / contracts of employment/ are not my areas of expertise.

Very fortunately in the last 12 months <u>Simon Bowler</u> has been House Chairman. He oversees changes in the lighting, gas and electricity meters, adherence to fire regulations, health and safety issues and more.

However, we have no Chair and no Treasurer. There are job descriptions for these roles if you might be interested. Even if it is not for you, you might have a neighbour or friend recently moved to the area who likes sport and wants to be involved in a worthwhile Sidmouth activity; please tell them about this and ask them to get in touch.

The issue becomes 'how will the Club function without them' if no-one comes forward – and it's not good news.

It may be that we need to appoint a professional accountant to undertake the role currently performed by the Treasurer and we may need to employ a Manager to run the Club. The Club is a behemoth – premises, grounds, employment of staff, contracts to oversee and the general running of the Club.

If we need to do either of these the costs will be considerable and there will be a large increase in our membership subscription, not just the £10 increase we have managed to keep it to in the last 12 months. That is the reality.

Questions are invited pertaining to the SCTCC or the GMC.

Leaving those issues aside:

On the grounds side <u>Colin Whitehall</u> retires at the end of October. I think we are aware that his first love is the cricket pitch. The cricket chairman shared a chart with me recently which showed that for their leagues the referees score the grounds for the quality after each match and in their league the Sidmouth pitch was rated top. Colin's role is being taken on by Toby who has 3 years' experience and qualifications to back it up.

Helping Jackie in the kitchens this evening is her husband, Doug Yeabsley who sits on the GMC as Grounds Chairman overseeing the grounds management, and is assisted very much by <u>Andrew</u> <u>Thomas</u>. At the AGM of the Main Club a few weeks back, Andrew was awarded Life Membership of the Club in recognition of his outstanding contribution to all sections.

As a section we are making a collection for Colin on his retirement and this will be circulated during the meeting and available in hut 3 later if you would like to contribute.
