Sidmouth Croquet Section Chair's Report for the Croquet Section AGM – October 2025

I would like to start by updating you on the issues relating to the SCTCC (the Sidmouth Cricket, Tennis, and Croquet Club) of which we are a part. I refer to this as the Main Club.

Charitable status has been granted and the subscribers have approved the transfer of the ownership of the ground from the Grounds Trust to the new charity with the formal transfer scheduled for December 1st. This will give us security going forwards. Roger Mills has worked tirelessly on this project which was recognized by awarding him Honorary Life Membership by the Main Club at their AGM last month.

The Croquet Section has for years been well regarded and has contributed a lot of expertise to the running of the Main Club. Some of our members will recall Tony Dustan-Smith and David Temple with their important work in installing a water tank, a bore hole and a sprinkler system as well as having all the lawns reseeded. The involvement of Croquet players with the Main Club continues. Peter Nelson is President, Stuart Haydon is Honorary Secretary and Simon Bowler has just stood down as House Chairman after more than 4 years though is still available to assist. Simon's contribution was recently recognized with the award of Volunteer of the Year. Being House Chairman involves acquiring quotes for such things as thatching and security but also engaging contractors where there are gas or electricity issues or water leakage such as occurred recently above lawn 2. We are pleased that the post vacated by Simon has now been filled by David Taylor, one of our new croquet members. Offers of support have been received from Peter Regan and Steph Abrahams. Thank you to them all.

But what most of us enjoy, and for which we joined the croquet section is playing croquet and we have a whole range of playing opportunities to suit all standards.

Our season got off to a good start with two taster days followed by coaching sessions from which we gained 24 new members, bringing our total to 124, an increase of 13 over the previous year.

Club sessions are popular, especially amongst the Golf Croquet (GC) players who have to wait their turn to go on the courts. For beginners, friendly games have been arranged against Budleigh and Exeter to give them their first taste of competitive play. League matches for GC and AC, both level play and handicap games, have been played across the South West, from Poole to St Agnes and up to Bristol and beyond. Our thanks to all who have managed those tournaments.

Internal Tournaments have been popular with players likely to know their opponents. For those wanting a higher standard of play, Open Tournaments are held here for players across the country which our players can sign up for. The culmination of our season was hosting The President's Cup – an AC Tournament to which the top 8 national players are invited by Croquet England.

Our whole year has benefitted from the beautiful weather so matches could take place as scheduled – a rare event. We are also very grateful to our volunteers and Andrew Thomas in particular for working alongside the groundstaff to prepare lawns and set hoops – we will need more hoop setters next year please.

Club sessions continue over the winter and lawns can be booked for friendly games although everything is weather dependent.
